## **THF Grant Helps Preserve Collection** of Early Wine Authority

The story behind Mr. Munson's part in Texas history is an

interesting one. He arrived in Denison in 1876, convinced that the area was a grape paradise. Through the remaining years of his life, he developed three hundred superior grape varieties from the wild native grapes of the area and found a resistant rootstock to stop an epidemic in the early 1900s that saved France's wine industry. His work was the basis for a viticulture (cultivation of grapevines)

and enology (the study of wines) curriculum at Grayson College-one of the few such degreed programs in the country and the first of its kind at a Texas community college.
